

Stamford Public Schools Provides Second Update on Long-Term Vision and Strategic Planning Process

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Stamford, Conn.— Stamford Public Schools (SPS) began its long-term visioning and strategic planning process in partnership with Cambridge Education, a management consulting organization specializing in school improvement and education change management, in late 2016.

In order to gather input and guidance from a broad range of stakeholders, the district hosted the first of three planned SPS Visioning and Strategic Planning Advisory Committee meetings on March 7, 2017. More than 150 members of the committee spent more than an hour sharing ideas and providing input.
