El Quijote Award

The Hispanic Parade Organization recently recognized **Westhill High School Paraeducator Lucas Romero** with the El Quijote award for his commitment and dedication to the Hispanic community. Each year, in conjunction with Hispanic Heritage Month, the organization recognizes outstanding community leaders in the New York Metropolitan area. Lucas was one of only three honored from Connecticut and among only 21 leaders in all to receive the 2019 El Quijote award.

Altice USA 2019 Hispanic Heritage Month Essay Contest

Academy of Information Technology & Engineering (AITE) Junior Carlee Reid took first place and a \$1,500 scholarship in the Altice USA Hispanic Heritage Month Essay Contest. In honor of Hispanic Heritage Month, Altice USA invited middle and high school students to submit essays that responded to the prompt: "Name a Latino, past or present, who has inspired you to dream big." Reid's winning essay "The Music of Manzanero," described how the music of the Mexican musician, singer and composer, Armando Manzanero, inspired her. Carlee is the only high school student from Connecticut to be recognized this year.

SERC 2019 Parental Involvement Recognition Award

The State Education Resource Center (SERC), in collaboration with the Commission on Women, Children, and Seniors, awarded two Stamford Public Schools parents, Regan Allan and Yadira Esquivel, with the 2019 Parental Involvement Recognition Award. Regan and Yadira were among only 11 Connecticut residents to be honored recently at a ceremony at the State Capitol. The award recognizes parent contributions to schools and communities across the state, specifically for support of, ability to make a difference in, and dedication and advocacy to ensure equity for all in their local schools. The Stamford Public Education Foundation (SPEF) nominated Regan, whose children currently attend Dolan Middle School and the Academy of Information Technology & Engineering. The Exchange Club Parenting Skills Center nominated Yadira, who has a child attending Toquam Elementary School.
