Fairfield County String Festival

CMEA Western Regional Festival

Thousands of students across Connecticut recently auditioned before a panel of professionals to be considered for the Connecticut Music Educators Association (CMEA) Western Regional High School and Middle School Festival. In addition to the six SPS high school students who qualified for the festival and were recognized last month, nine middle schoolers also qualified for the festival. Each student was required to perform a very advanced selection in his or her specialty area: Orchestra, Concert Band, Jazz Band or Chorus. Those students who scored above a designated threshold were invited to perform at the festival, which comprises the top high school or middle school instrumental or choral students in the western part of the state.

NELMS Spotlight School

The New England League of Middle Schools (NELMS) recently renewed its designation of **Scofield Magnet Middle School**, under the leadership of Principal **Scott Clayton**, as a *NELMS Spotlight School*. The Spotlight School Award recognizes schools that have a record of powerful and research-based learning for young adolescents and consistently observe middle-level best practices. Scofield was one of only 34 schools throughout New England designated by NELMS. The honor is based upon evidence and observations made during a site visit as well as the school's rigorous self-study.

2016-17 Connecticut State Department Accountability Reports

For the past three years, the Connecticut State Department of Education has instituted an Accountability System that evaluates schools on 21 indicators, including academics, absenteeism, physical fitness and graduation rates, among other measures. Two Stamford schools received recognition on February 2018 School Accountability Reports. **Toquam Magnet Elementary School**, under the leadership of Principal **Amy Beldotti**, was designated as a *School of Distinction* by the CSDE, for highest growth of high needs students. **Roxbury Elementary School**, under the leadership of Principal **Mark Bonasera** was recognized for *Exiting Focus School Status* for its improvement of high needs students in Science.
